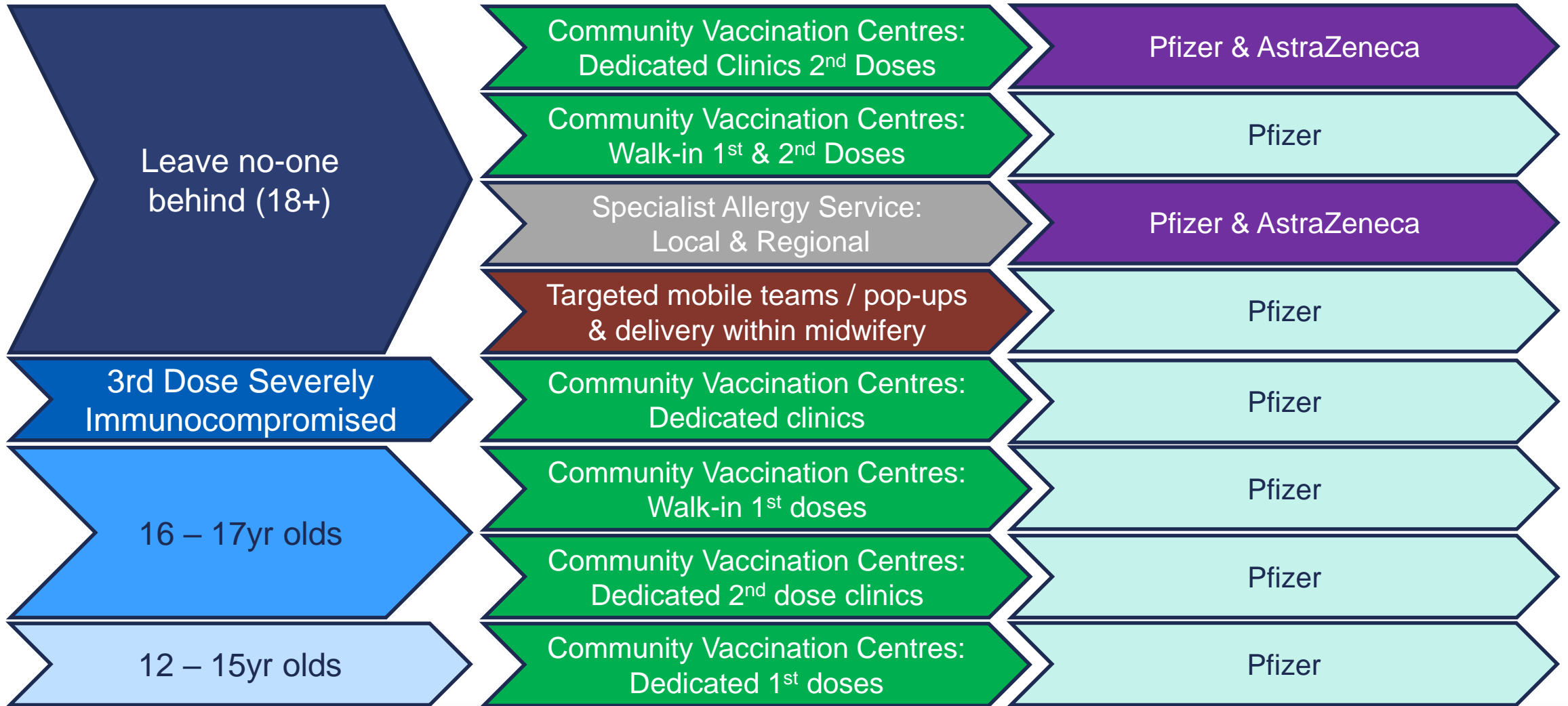
Aims of the CTM COVID-19 Vaccination Programme

- To develop and offer a COVID-19 vaccination programme to all eligible and consenting residents and health and care sector workers in Cwm Taf Morgannwg.
- To reduce the inequality in preventable disease distribution in Cwm Taf Morgannwg by increasing uptake of vaccinations in areas of deprivation and vulnerable populations.
- To design a COVID19 vaccination programme where capacity to deliver is directly aligned to vaccination supply.

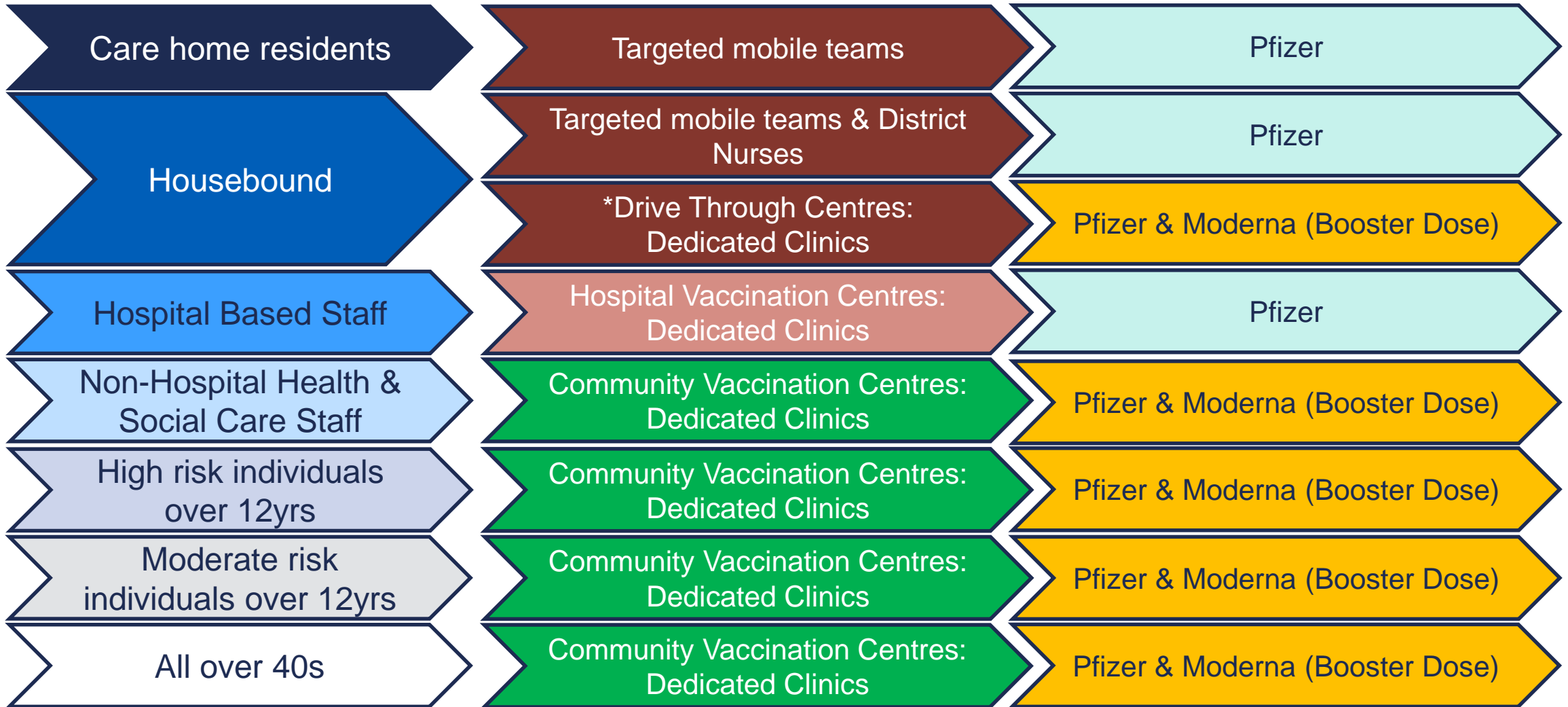
Current COVID-19 Vaccination Campaigns

1. **Leave No-One Behind:** the continued drive to ensure that everyone over 18 who wants to, and is eligible, can receive a primary COVID-19 vaccination course.
2. **Completion of a primary COVID-19 vaccination course for the Severely Immunocompromised:** those clinically identified as severely immunocompromised should receive a third full COVID-19 dose in order to complete their primary course – in some instances this must be administered at a time inline with particular treatment regime.
3. **COVID-19 Vaccination for 16-17yr olds:** those aged between 16-17yrs should receive a complete primary COVID-19 vaccination course.
4. **COVID-19 Vaccination for 12-15yr olds:** those aged between 12-15ys should receive a first dose vaccine
5. **COVID-19 Boosters:** current booster eligibility is over 40s and those who are at risk, including the clinically vulnerable and health and social care staff.

Considerations and Risks

- Impact of JCVI 15th November announcements:
 - For all healthy under 18's, vaccinations should only be given at least 12 weeks post the onset of COVID Symptoms or positive PCR
 - The addition of 40-49 yr olds for boosters adds significant numbers of people due their booster in December and January
- No agreed start date for 16-17yr olds second doses.
- Outstanding decisions remain from JCVI regarding 12-15yr old second doses and boosters for under 40 yr olds.
- No indication at this point what Autumn/Winter 2022/23 COVID-19 Booster campaign.
- Continuous workforce challenges, compounded by current funding ending in March 2022.
- 4 out of 5 Community Vaccination Centres have been secured up to June 2022.
- Work continues to balance vaccination capacity with demand – understanding how to accommodate the competing demands of 16-17yr second doses versus boosters.
