1. SITUATION/BACKGROUND

1.1 HIW and WAO have undertaken a joint review of quality governance arrangements at Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board. The review looks at how Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board's overall governance arrangements support delivery of high quality, safe and effective services.

2. SPECIFIC MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION BY THIS MEETING (ASSESSMENT)

- 2.1 The joint review, as set out in the terms of reference looked to address the following overall question: Do Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board's governance arrangements support delivery of high quality, safe and effective services? The following key lines of enquiry were considered:
 - Is the quality and safety of services understood at an operational level, with concerns adequately acted upon?
 - Is the quality and safety of services understood at the corporate level, with concerns adequately acted upon?
 - Does the organisation promote an open, listening and learning culture to support the delivery of high quality, safe and effective services?
- 2.2 WAO/HIW published their joint review report on the 19 November 2019.

3 KEY RISKS/MATTERS FOR ESCALATION TO BOARD/COMMITTEE

- 3.1 The publication of the report highlighted a number of significant findings for CTMuHB, including the need to:
 - Place a greater focus on the quality of our services
 - Develop and deliver stronger systems for quality governance
 - Strengthen leadership
 - Strengthen how we identify and manage risk



- Develop a culture that supports the delivery of high quality, compassionate and continually improving care.
- 3.2 The management response to the report can be seen as Appendix A, and sits in the context of CTMuHB being subject to enhanced performance arrangements with Welsh Government in Special Measures (SM) for Maternity Services, and under Targeted Intervention (TI) for quality governance, culture and leadership, trust and confidence. Secondly, we have had reports that have highlighted limitations in our systems and processes for quality governance. To address these, we have been working closely with our Regulators, the Delivery Unit, staff, patients, partners and the Welsh Government, taking the learning and recommendations from other relevant reports to formulate a coherent forward plan. We have made some progress on some of these issues and therefore welcome the fact that this report recognises those early shoots of recovery which, although very much in their infancy, offer sense of a right direction of travel.
