# 2. HIGHLIGHT REPORT

ALERT / ESCALATE	There were no items identified for Alert/Escalation.
	A presentation led by the Assistant Director of Information, ICT was <b>received</b> providing an <b>overview of ICT service delivery</b> both pre and post Covid-19. Committee Members praised the achievements, robust cyber security and system recovery arrangements in place particularly in light of the increased need for home working.
	It was <b>noted</b> that whilst Covid-19 had brought about some delays in implementing aspects of the <b>digitisation plan</b> , confidence in the delivery of the actions within a revised timetable was good. Members <b>noted</b> the end-product would bring about different ways of working which would have a range of benefits to patients, the staff involved in delivering care as well as the supporting teams such as clinical coders. Internal Audit Reports on Records Digitisation and Cyber Security were <b>noted</b> .
ADVISE	It was <b>noted</b> that further work would be necessary to move to a <b>national Patient Administration System</b> in conjunction with partners in NWIS (NHS Wales Informatics Service) which was key to unlocking CTM's digital ambition.
	It was <b>noted</b> that CTM was seeking to recruit a <b>Chief Information Officer</b> which would have a significant role to play, along with senior leaders in addressing the cultural challenges that lay ahead in moving to digital means of working.
	Reports were also <b>noted</b> in respect of <b>Clinical Coding</b> which had been received from NWIS and Audit Wales. The Committee <b>noted</b> that further internal audits were planned around this service and that a <b>Clinical Audit Assurance Framework</b> was also being developed. It was agreed that the Assistant Director for Performance & Information would attend the next meeting to address further points of clarity around the

Clinical Coding function.

	A report was also <b>received</b> from the Public Service Ombudsman into Lost and Mislaid Records and Digital Inclusion in Health & Care Wales.
	Draft Terms of Reference (TOR) which had previously been approved by the Board at its July 2020 meeting were <b>noted</b> . The ToR confirmed that Dilys Jouvenat was the Committee Vice- Chair.
ASSURE	Highlight reports were received from the <b>Digital Health Strategy Steering Group</b> and <b>Information Governance Group</b> . It was <b>agreed</b> that more detailed reports would be prepared for future meetings given that these forums had now restarted following cancellation during the spring and summer period due to Coronavirus.
	In considering the Committee's <b>forward work programme</b> it was agreed to include the topic of business continuity and lessons learned from Covid-19. Those present were invited to make suggestions to further populate the programme.
INFORM	Two policies were <b>approved</b> by the Committee, namely:  • The Freedom of Information Act Policy  • Clinical Coding Policy.
