2. HIGHLIGHT REPORT

ALERT / ESCALATE	There were no matters to alert / escalate to the Board.
ADVISE	The Committee noted that due to operational pressures and staff sickness it had not been possible to provide three reports for the meeting. The Committee agreed to receive the reports at a follow-up meeting to be held on 10 December 2020. The Committee received and discussed a report outlining the responses to the Annual Committee Self-Assessment. Members noted that a summarised version had been drafted with an action plan which is now being circulated to Members for comment.
ASSURE	The Committee received the MHA Breaches and Errors Report for Quarter 2 and noted there had been a 24% reduction in errors. The Committee noted that during this period there had been three fundamental breaches and agreed to receive a report on the actions and learning arising from the breaches as part of the report prepared for the next meeting of the Committee in February 2021. The Committee received the report on the Risks Relating to the MHA for Quarter 1 and noted that work to develop a regional Crisis Care Concordat was progressing which provided opportunities to further develop multi-agency partnership working across the region. The Committee noted that all hearings that had initially been postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic had now all been completed.



	The Committee received and noted the strategic update from SWP.
INFORM	The Committee received and noted the report on the impact of Covid-19 on patients subject to the Mental Health Act. Members noted the effect of the pandemic on Mental Health Services was continuing to have and paid tribute to the partnership working between all of the agencies to uphold safety and emotional health and wellbeing during this unprecedented period.
