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Audit Committee Update

About this document

- 1 This document provides the Audit Committee with an update on current and planned Audit Wales work. Accounts and performance audit work are considered, and information is also provided on the Auditor General's wider programme of national value-for-money examinations and the work of our Good Practice Exchange (GPX).

Accounts audit update

- 2 **Exhibit 1** summarises the status of our key accounts audit work to be reported during 2020-21.

Audit of the 2019-20 Funds Held on Trust Account	<p>Due to the transfer of the Bridgend County Borough to the Health Board on 1 April 2019, the Funds Held on Trust Account requires a full set of accounts and audit for 2019-20.</p> <p>The audited account is due to be considered by trustee members on 28 January 2021, and if approved and signed, is due to be certified by the Audit General on 29 January.</p> <p>The Charity Commission's deadline for audit certification is 31 January 2021.</p>
Audit of the 2020-21 Accountability Report and Financial Statements	<p>We have been examining the Health Board's aged current liabilities as at 31 August 2020. We scheduled these examinations to follow the review by Director of Finance, which he reported to you in October. Our 2021 Audit Plan, which you will be considering on 8 February, provides an update.</p> <p>More generally, we have commenced our 2020-21 audit planning, key aspects of which are also set out in the 2021 Audit Plan.</p>

Good Practice events and products

- 4 In addition to the audit work set out above, we continue to seek opportunities for finding and sharing good practice from all-Wales audit work through our forward planning, programme design and good practice research. All shared learning seminars listed in our original 2020-21 Annual Plan have been cancelled.
- 5 In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, we have established a Covid-19 Learning Project to support public sector efforts by sharing learning through the pandemic. This is not an audit project; it is intended to help prompt some thinking, and hopefully support the exchange of practice. We have produced a number of outputs as part of the project which are relevant to the NHS, the details of which are available here. We are now in the process of developing a programme of webinars with an emphasis on practical knowledge transfer between peers and practitioners in relation to COVID learning. The next webinar - Mental health and wellbeing during COVID-19 - is scheduled to take place on December 1, 2020.

NHS-related national studies and related products

- 6 The Audit Committee may also be interested in the Auditor General's wider programme of national value for money studies, some of which focus on the NHS and pan-public-sector topics. These studies are typically funded through the Welsh Consolidated Fund and are presented to the Public Accounts Committee to support its scrutiny of public expenditure.
