**1. SITUATION/BACKGROUND**

1.1 The Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act 2014, requires RPB to produce a Population Needs Assessment on a five-year cycle. The first

was produced in 2017. The 2022 Assessment is now completed and in the process of being published.

- 1.2 In addition to the population assessment there is a requirement to produce a Market Stability report by June 2022. Both the population assessment and Market Stability reports will inform the development of the Area Plan (April 2023) and future commissioning Strategies.

- 1.3 To enhance the citizen voice element of the assessment a '100 Days of Engagement' Programme was launched to ensure the Community and citizen voice is reflected in future planning.

### Specific areas for consideration

- 1.4 The structure for the assessment is centred around the priority groups as listed within the guidance and Act.
- 1.5 To ensure equal consideration is given to all the priorities the primary groupings are older people and children and young people, with specific information for each of the following sub-categories underneath:
- Health and physical disabilities
  - Learning disabilities and autism
  - Mental health

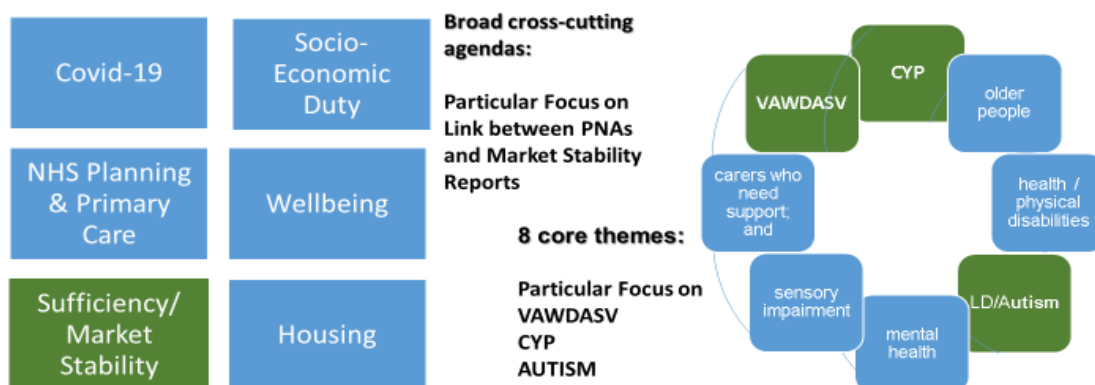
- Sensory impairment
- Carers who need support
- Violence against women, domestic abuse and sexual violence
- And Secure estate

1.6 In addition to the pre-listed priorities there are a number of themes included in the subcategories that present key pieces of information that do not neatly fit into the priorities, these are:

- Economic wellbeing
- Skills and knowledge
- General health
- Housing
- Safety
- Social connectedness

1.7 Supplementary advice has been added since the original assessments back in 2017, see below:

## Community Engagement

1.8 The Programme provided unique and varied opportunities for individuals, groups and organisations to articulate their needs and perceptions of the services on offer across the region.

1.9 A regional engagement group was established with 65 members (meeting weekly) representing 28 organisations. To support members to engage with their stakeholders effectively an

engagement toolkit was developed and the Engagement and Communication Officer for the RPB led a series of 'In This Together' workshops to equip partners with the skills and knowledge to undertake engagement activities.

1.10 By the end of the assessment, six events had been held, which involve participants undertaking creative activities to express what really matters to them. A 'CTM Community Voices' podcast series and a campaign called 'By Your Side CTM' was launched to encourage people across the region to share their voice and advocate for those who may feel unheard.

1.11 The RPB website is regularly updated with engagement activity and how individuals and organisations can get involved including regular YouTube updates, social media content and emails.
