Platinum Corporate Health Standard Award

The Corporate Health Standard is a free service which is funded as part of the Welsh Government's 'Healthy Working Wales' programme. It is the national quality framework and award for employers to improve health and well-being in the workplace. Any workplace in Wales with more than 50 employees can take part.

The Corporate Health Standard has four levels of award to recognise each stage of the developmental health and well-being work achieved by employers. The four levels are Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum. The framework begins at Bronze with a foundation of legislation, organisational support and policies and interventions which address the key workplace risks to employee health and well-being. It builds to Platinum which is the beacon for exemplar employers who demonstrate sustainable business practices and take full account of their corporate social responsibilities.



Platinum Corporate Health Standard Award

Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board have previously been awarded Platinum level and have recently been through the reassessment against the Standard.

A meeting with the Healthier Working Wales Assessor was held on Monday 20th March 2023 where the above report was discussed in detail.

Following this discussion, the assessor confirmed that Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board was successful in retaining the Platinum Award and issued a highly positive feedback report which is attached as Appendix 2.
