ADVISE	The Tier 1 targets for reducing health care associated infection have not been revised since 2019/20 and have been extend further for 2021/22.	
	For the period April – May 2021, Cwm Taf Morgannwg UHB have reported more cases for all five mandatory surveillance organisms compared to the same period last year. A significant proportion are community acquired infections.	
	Local reduction expectations for each of the Integrated Locality Groups (ILGs) have been agreed and progress will be monitored via local infection prevention and control meetings.	
	Urgent investment is required to recruit and appoint a dedicated Infection, Prevention & Control (IPC) resource for primary care to scope and introduce targeted interventions to improve IPC practices and reduce antimicrobial usage and resistance. A report will be presented to the Infection Prevention and Control Committee in September.

With support from shared services colleagues, an internal review is being undertaken to look at the current decontamination infrastructure, processes and systems within CTMUHB. Recommendations to follow.



	The Endoscopy Unit in Princess of Wales (POW) achieved an amber rating in the recent JAG audit undertaken by Shared Services colleagues. Work is ongoing to standardise decontamination of laryngoscope handles. A recall notice has been received for a batch of Clinell Universal wipes and further work is underway to determine if there are links to the outbreak of Burkholderia aenigmatica in England. Work has commenced to integrate the antimicrobial guidelines across the Organisation.
