Introduction

This Patient Safety and Experience Highlight Report provides an 'at a glance' update on the current patient safety and experience landscape within the Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust and Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board area. It specifically focusses upon the following key areas:

Summary

We can see from the data presented in the following slides, that following 2,519 handover presentations at Emergency departments within Cwm Taf Morgannwg, 1,539 were outside of the 15 minute notification to handover target time.

In addition to this, 618 patients waited between 1 hour and 10 hours to handover care to Emergency department staff, with an additional 32 patients waiting in excess of 10 hours.

During the month of December, 403 patients awaited a primary response in the community between 6 and 32 hours. From the data contained within slide 8, it can be seen that 342 of these patients were in the Amber 1/2 category. These categories include, chest pain, stroke, dyspnoea, overdose, abdominal pain, allergic reactions, unconsciousness (and fainting). Significantly, the chest pain and stroke patients (if confirmed +ve) would by definition have missed the opportunity for clinical intervention such as PPCI and Thrombolysis.

97 patients (19 x Amber1, 58 x Amber2, 7 x Green2, 13 x Green3) waited beyond 12 hours to 32 hours for a community response.




Number of Patients Waiting Outside Hospital in Excess of 60 minutes







Joint Investigation Framework – Appendix b

Joint Investigation Framework – Appendix b (Source: SCIF)

The Joint Investigation Framework includes all Health Boards and Trusts in Wales, and relates to patient safety incidents escalated by The Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust (WAST) that have been considered at the Serious Case Incident Forum (SCIF) and where the primary causal factor relates to or as a consequence of Health Board hospital handover delays.

During December there were two incidents that were reviewed at the SCIF which met the criteria for the appendix b framework.

- Delayed response to a 55 year old Covid-19+ patient reported as struggling to breathe.
 ROLE was implemented at scene. Hospital handover delays were a significant factor in our ability to respond sooner.
- Delayed response (7hrs) to a 75 year old Covid-19+ patient reported to be having difficulty breathing. The patient was conveyed to RGHP but did not survive the event.

During December the Trust has received no Regulation 28's in relation to hospital handover delays within the Cwm Taf Morgannwg Health Board Area.

Patient Experience

Patient Experience

Incidents reported:

- GP arranged medical admission to PCHM. On arrival at 22:07 A&E staff declined admission of the patient and GP lounge staff stated they had no space for the patient. A nurse took the patients observations and no further contact was received. At 00:05 the patient was still on the EA and their NEWS was now 9. A&E were advised of the patients deterioration and the patient was then accepted into Resus.
- Immediate release request declined for a 17 month old child with ineffective breathing.
- 22 year old female patient with pregnancy issues held on EA outside PCHM for 14+hrs.
- 97 year old female patient who had fallen and was suffering with D&V and dehydration was held on EA outside PCHM for 6+hrs.
- 74 year old female patient with query CVA held on EA outside PCHM for 6+hrs.
- 76 year old male patient suffering with chest pain held on EA outside POWB for 6+hrs.
- 79 year old female patient with hip and knee injuries found on floor, held on EA outside POWB for 6+hrs.
