You asked:

In the last 12 months, how many attendances have there been at A&E Departments, with a primary diagnosis of an "alcohol related" incident, and how does this compare with numbers for the previous year?

In the last 12 months, how many attendances have there been at A&E Departments, where alcohol was mentioned in the attendance notes, and how does this compare with numbers for the previous year?

The information you require would be recorded within an individual patient's health record as part of their ongoing care. To provide you with this information, would require a manual trawl and significantly exceed the 18 hours time and £450 cost limit set out within Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act.

If possible, how many bed days were lost in the last 12 months for alcohol-related incidences and how does this compare with the 12 months previous?
