

You asked:

First, could you tell me how many Atopic Dermatitis patients have been treated by your Health Board in the latest four months that you have data available for, and how many of these patients were paediatric versus adult?

The systems used by the University Health Board do not record the diagnosis at outpatient referral or attendance level. Therefore we are unable to provide this information.

Second, for all Atopic Dermatitis patients (adult plus paediatric) treated by your Health Board in the latest four months, could you please provide the number of patients treated with each of the following:

High Potency topical steroids

Ultraviolet light therapy

Azathioprine

Ciclosporin

Methotrexate

Mycophenolate mofetil

Acitretin

Alitretinoin

Dupilumab

Upadacitinib

Tacrolimus

Pimecrolimus

I can confirm that the University Health Board does not centrally record medicine use linked to atopic dermatitis. The information you require would be recorded within an individual patient's health record as part of their ongoing care. To provide you with this information, would require a manual trawl and significantly exceed the 18 hours time and £450 cost limit set out within Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act.
