

Freedom of Information Request: Our Reference CTMUHB_397_20

Clarification requested and provided on the 24 November:

With regards to questions 3 and 4 - are you asking if we as a Health Board own such services? As we would not be able to answer how many services exist in the health board area as we would not be aware of them all.

I am interested in services which are considered NHS services please, I assume these would be services owned by LHB. If you only have access to information relating to what services the LHB owns then this would be great.

With regards to question 5 – Please can you state for what timeframe you require this information to cover (last financial year for example)?

Last financial year (ideally 2019/2020)

With regards to questions 6 and 7 – are you asking for services we have commissioned for our patients? Again, if this is the case please can you state what timeframe you require this information to cover?

Yes please - services that you have commissioned for your patients. Again, in the last financial year please (ideally 2019/2020).

1. How many inpatient NHS services do you have in your local health board?

I can confirm that Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board provide mental health services in the following inpatient settings:

Acute Adult Inpatient Services

- Ward 14 Princess of Wales Hospital, Psychiatric Intensive Care Units (one in Princess of Wales Hospital, one in Royal Glamorgan Hospital), Admissions Ward Royal Glamorgan Hospital, Ward 21, 22 and 23 Royal Glamorgan Hospital

Older Adult Inpatient Services

- Ward 15 Princess of Wales Hospital, Ward 1, 2 & 3 Angelton Clinic Glanrhyd Hospital, Seren Ward and St David's Unit Royal Glamorgan Hospital and Ward 7 Ysbyty Cwm Cynon.

Rehabilitation Services

- Supported Recovery Unit Ysbyty George Thomas, Pinewood House Treorchy and Cefn Yr Afon Bridgend.

2. What is the categorisation of these NHS inpatient services (e.g. open, locked rehabilitation, low, medium)

- Princess of Wales Hospital Ward 14 - open
- Princess of Wales Hospital PICU – locked
- Glanrhyd Angelton Clinic Ward 1 - open
- Glanrhyd Angelton Clinic Ward 2 - open
- Glanrhyd Angelton Clinic Ward 3 - open
- We have two open rehab wards and one locked rehab ward.
- Ysbyty Cwm Cynon Ward 7 - open
- Royal Glamorgan Mental Health Unit Seren & St.David’s Older Adult Wards – Open
- Royal Glamorgan Mental Health Unit Admissions - Open
- Royal Glamorgan Mental Health Unit Ward 21 - Open
- Royal Glamorgan Mental Health Unit Ward 22 - Open
- Royal Glamorgan Mental Health Unit Ward 23 – Open
- Royal Glamorgan Mental Health Unit PICU – Locked

3. How many private-run inpatient services do you have in your local health board?

I can confirm that the health board owns no private-run inpatient mental health services.

4. How many third-sector run inpatient services do you in your local health board?

I can confirm that the health board owns no third sector run inpatient services.

5. How many service-users were admitted to an NHS-run mental health inpatient facility? What type of service were they admitted too? (locked, low, medium)

I can confirm from Benchmarking figures submitted to Welsh Government the following data on NHS run mental health inpatient admissions for financial year 2019-2020; 697 Adult Acute, 322 Older Adult, 99 PICU, 13 Cefn Yr Afon Rehab, 30 Pinewood House Rehab, 15 Supported Recovery Unit Rehab.

6. How many service-users were admitted to a private-run mental health inpatient facility? What type of service were they admitted too? (locked, low, medium)

I can confirm that in the financial year of 2019-20 there were 22 admissions to private run low secure hospitals and 7 admissions to locked rehabilitation.

7. How many service-users were admitted to a third sector run mental health inpatient facility? What type of service were they admitted too? (locked, low, medium)

I can confirm that no service-users were admitted to third sector inpatient facilities in the financial year 2019-20.
