Any YP who has been listed as 'Gender Diverse' by S-CAMHS'. Alternatively, to be specific, please use the definition of gender dysphoria as per NHS Wales: https://111.wales.nhs.uk/Genderdysphoria/

"Gender dysphoria is a term that describes a sense of unease that a person may have because of a mismatch between their biological sex and their gender identity."

Also any YP who has either socially transitioned or medically transitions - that is, identifying NOT as the biological sex assigned at birth.

You asked:

1. Of the young people in Specialist Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (S-CAMHS), how many YP are 'Gender Diverse (or applicable terminology)' and can I have the statistical breakdown for the last 3 years.

Of the young people in Specialist Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (S-CAMHS), 89 have been classed as 'Gender Diverse' (or applicable terminology) in the last 3 years.

Of these YP, can I please have:

2. The average age of the YP being referred

We are unable to provide the average age, but we can provide an age bracket of young people being referred. 74 young people were 12-17 years old, and 15 young people were 5-11 years old.

3. The average wait time

The average wait time was 7 weeks.

4. The percentage of which were either diagnosed with Autism, awaiting an autism assessment or showed autistic traits?
