Freedom of Information Request: Our Reference CTMUHB_590_24

You asked:

Under the FOI act, could you please provide me with up to date waiting time figures for a Hysteroscopy, preferably including a median waiting time or numbers seen within 8 weeks and total numbers on the list (so a % can be calculated), but whatever information is available. Could you also provide these figures for patients where a consultant or doctor has marked it 'urgent'?

Our response:

We can confirm, from June 2024 to November 2024, a total of 275 patients were referred for an Urgent Hysteroscopy. Of those, 252 (91,6%) were seen within 8 weeks and 23 patients (8.4%) where seen over 8 weeks. These included:

- 13 Routine Coils
- 6 Mini touch
- 1 Cancelled by Hospital
- 1 Taken off for an urgent case
- 1 One day over the 8 weeks
- 1 Offered just under 10 weeks

Please note - routine coils don't need to be seen within 8 weeks therefore these appointments are not prioritised. Mini touch treatment appointments often have an extended wait, as we have to wait for the biopsy to come back and these appointments are always completed by a consultant not the nurse Hysteroscopist. Additionally, a consultant usually likes to have these patients on their list, so the wait can be longer.
