We are not referring to signposting/referrals and meeting papers communications, as we are party to these, and we are included in the email chain. Therefore, I think it is clear to understand that we wouldn't require such disclosure, as they are readily accessible to us within our files.

We seek to understand the defamation to our organisation as we have been told by professionals that emails have recently been sent out to '*avoid/not refer to Mothers Matter*'.

Thank you for refining your search in relation to this request. Based on the new criteria, an additional search was carried out. These emails are outlined in the table below.

Where you are a recipient of the correspondence they have not been disclosed. As you may be aware under FOIA personal data is exempt, they would therefore require redaction and you are already in receipt of the emails.

However, where you are not the recipient, an extract has been provided as per Attachment 1. Please note, where there is personal information (names and email addresses) these have been withheld. This decision has been made as it is not within the expectations of the individual that their personal data would be put into the public domain. This information is classed as personal data of third parties and is therefore being withheld in accordance with section 40 (2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) by virtue of section 40 (3) (a) (i) of the Act which permits a public authority to withhold personal data other than the requester's where the disclosure would breach a Data Protection Principle.

The Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA) / General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) defines personal data as data which relates to a living individual who can be identified solely from that data or from that data and other information which is in the possession of the data controller.
