Freedom of Information Request: Our Reference CTMUHB_212_25

You asked:

- When renovated, which services will be housed in the Princess of Wales hospital, and when is the restoration of those services anticipated. Which wards will be affected by the decision to return to Bridgend, and which will remain at Royal Glamorgan hospital.**

In our initial response to you, we confirmed that this is still progressing and no decisions had been made, we were therefore unable to answer this element of your question. However, as work to replace the roof at Princess of Wales hospital remains on schedule, we can now share with you the next phase of planned return moves to the site.

Starting at the beginning of June, the following moves will take place:

Please note that the dates stated above are when we anticipate moves will happen. These may be subject to slight change, based on service demand.

2. I would like to see the correspondence whether written or electronic on this matter, and memos and minutes of meetings since the acute problem with the roof became apparent in late 2024.

As we confirmed, we are unable to search the 23.6GB of data to confirm if any of the correspondence meets your criteria.

The Health Board does hold some of this information, however, to provide you with this would require a manual trawl and significantly exceed the 18 hours' time and £450 cost limit set out within Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act. Using the search terms provided, the time and initial correspondence including Board Members, we can confirm that the search returned 23.6 GB of data after de-duplication. This included in excess of 5600 emails.

It would take us in excess of 93 hours to review all the items in order to identify and extract those that are relevant and in scope of your request. To confirm, this is a preliminary search. This does not cover the information that we may ultimately decide to disclose and we are unable to take account of the time likely to be taken in removing any information, which could be exempt at this stage.

This figure is based on a timescale of an estimated average one minute per item, there being approximately 5600 items to review. Therefore, to obtain the data would work out at approximately 93 hours @ £25.00 per hour (cost permitted under the act) = £2325.
